A. Enrollment Summary

Principal Grossenburg provided the following information,

- Enrollment Summary is at 94.61

- If everything remains the same after the States education budget and adjustments, the school should have about \$100,000 in excess funding at the end of the year

B. Predicted Graduation Report

Principal Grossenburg presented the Predicted Graduation Report. The report is attached.

Michael J. Sabath asked the following questions,

What is the graduation rate that the school is looking to meet for school improvement and what was the rate for last year. Principal Grossenburg replied 67% for this year and 46% for last year.

Is Edgenuity made available to all students. Principal Grossenburg replied yes, it is available to all students. Most of the students do take advantage of it and others do not like the online platform.

The factors that are really affecting the graduation rates are the presence of guardians in the home and attendance. What do you try to do with the other dimensions? Principal Grossenburg replied home visits are always the most proactive.

Regarding mental illness, what kind of mental illness is happening and do they self disclose it? Principal Grossenburg replied it's a variety, from extreme anxiety to schizophrenia. Yes, students do self disclose it and they are receiving services.

Principal Grossenburg informed the Board, about 38 to 41 students will be graduating this year. The ceremony will be at the Historic Theater in Downtown Yuma on May 22, 2025 at 6:00 p.m. All members will receive an invitation to attend the ceremony.

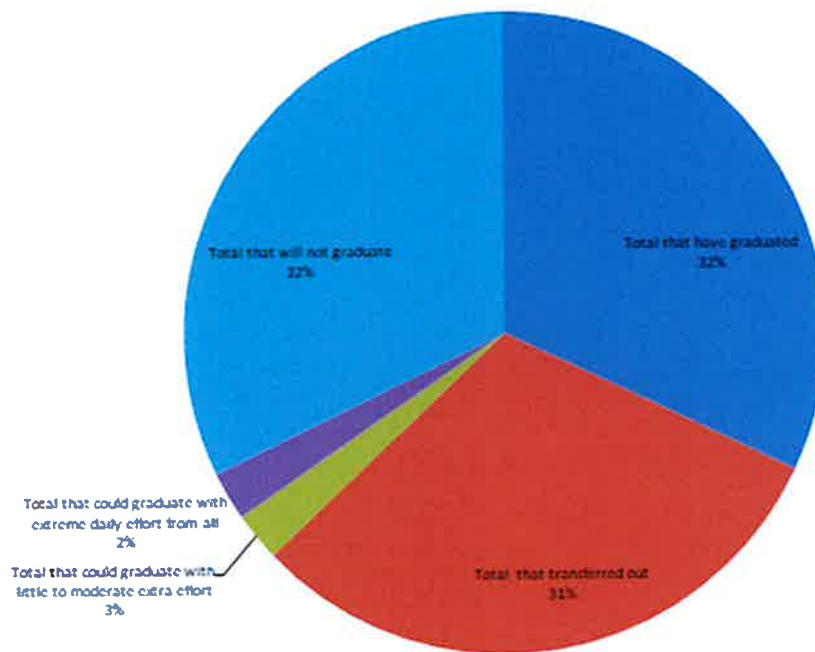

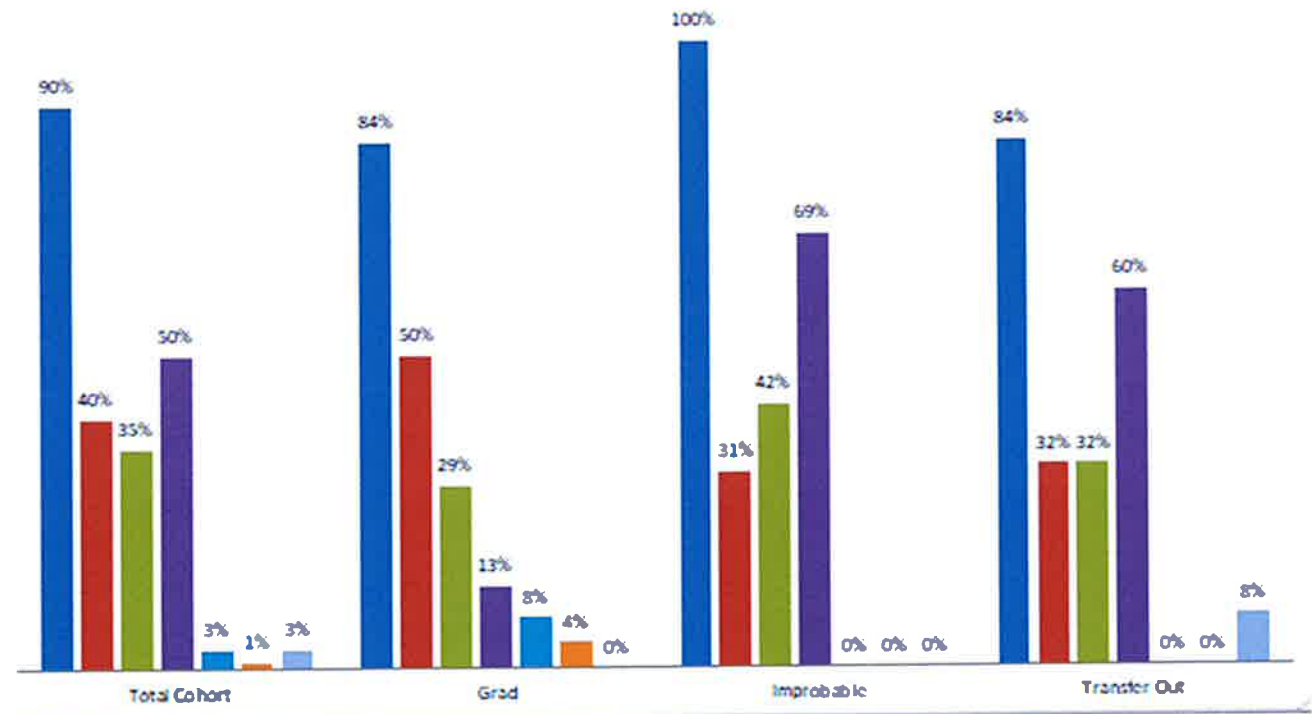

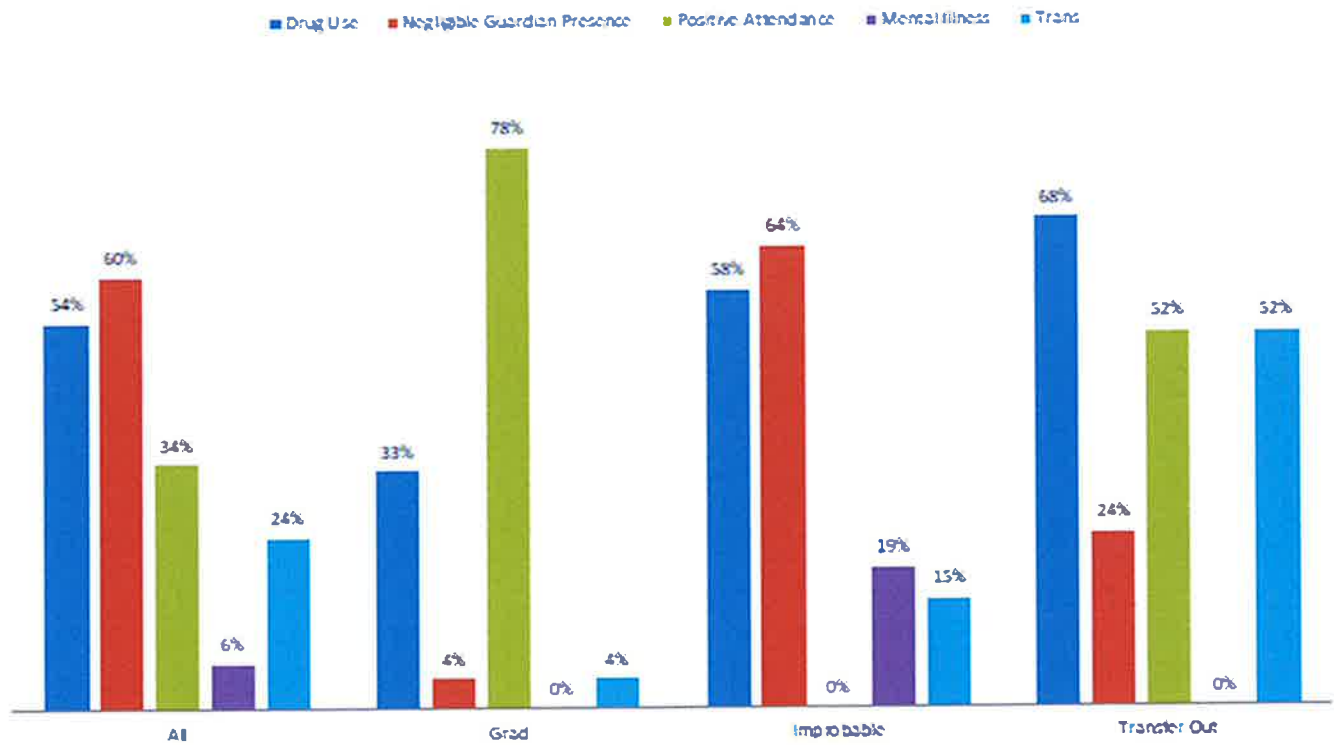
